


IN THE CIRCUIT COURT OF THE TENTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT OF

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2007-02

Effective January 01, 2008, the following policy, regarding head coverings in the Courtroom shall be in effect:

There shall be no wearing of any head covering by an individual, when present in any Courtroom in the Tenth Judicial Circuit. The only exceptions shall be for individuals undergoing medical treatment and those head coverings worn because of a sincere, genuine and authentic religious belief. If a question arises as to the authenticity of any person's religious claim, then a deputy or bailiff shall bring the matter to the attention of a judge who shall then determine whether the individual is entitled, because of religious belief, to wear the head covering while in the Courtroom.
