
AMENDED AUTHORIZATION FOR ENTRY OF ORDERS OF SUPERVISION
IN MINOR TRAFFIC CASES

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Administrative Order 2003-01, entered January 21, 2003, is amended as follows:

Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 529 (c) and designation by the Conference of Chief Circuit Judges, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, effective April 19, 2017:

1. The Circuit Clerk of Peoria county is authorized to enter orders of supervision under Section 5-6-3.1 of the Unified Code of Corrections, as amended (730 ILCS 5/5-6-3.1), for traffic offenses satisfied pursuant to paragraph (a) of Supreme Court Rule 529, where the accused upon payment of the fines, penalties, and costs provided by law, agrees to attend and successfully complete a dispositional term of 90 days court supervision through the Court-approved Traffic Safety Program.
2. The Peoria County Driver Improvement Program is hereby approved by the Court, pursuant to standards set by the Conference of Chief Circuit Judges, and the accused in each case shall pay the Traffic Safety Program fee of \$50.00 for the in person Court approved program or if you are 21 years of age or older pay \$65.00 for the online Court approved Traffic Safety Program.
3. If you were under 18 years of age at the time your ticket was issued, you must appear in court with a parent or legal guardian to request the Court approved Traffic Safety Program with advanced payment.
4. In cases where the accused failed to file a certificate of successful completion of the Traffic Safety Program on or before the termination date of the supervision order, the supervision shall be revoked and conviction entered of record by the Circuit Court of Peoria County.
